Luke 20:27-38

²⁷ Some Sadducees—the ones who claim there is no resurrection—came forward to pose this question: ²⁸ “Teacher, Moses wrote that if a man’s brother dies leaving a wife and no child, the brother should marry the woman

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now widowed, to raise up children with her. ²⁹ Let's say that there were seven brothers. The first one married and died childless. ³⁰ The second brother then married the woman, ³¹ then the third, and so on. All seven died without leaving her any children. ³² Finally the woman herself died. ³³ At the resurrection, who will be her husband? Remember, seven married her." ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry each other, ³⁵ but those judged worthy of a place in the age to come and of the resurrection from the dead don't take husbands or wives. ³⁶ They can no longer die, like the angels—they are children of God, since they are children of the resurrection. ³⁷ That the dead rise again was even demonstrated by Moses when, in the passage about the bush, he called the Most High 'the God of Sarah and Abraham, and the God of Rebecca and Isaac, and the God of Leah and Rachel and Jacob.' ³⁸ God is not the God of the dead, but of the living. All are alive to God."
